South Zone Activities of ASI

Activity line up at AMAZE Charitable Trust

Mrs. Akila Vaidyanathan has been doing some extensive programmes of overall development @AMAZE in Coimbatore. Here is a report by her:

We have implemented Daksh@Home last year with one parent /student and this year we have 3 sets of outstation parents/students who come twice a month and we assess the student and train the parent to use technology to create and teach lessons for their child. It is progressing well

Also since April 2013 we has been working on the 16+ group through our program AMEYA where we train the student taking an individualized Lifespan approach and move them towards Vocation/Employment. We do not have any enrollment criteria and cater to the entire spectrum, depending on the severity of the challenges faced by the students we move them to the next level from where ever they are.

The first batch had 3 students (including Bharat who we trained for 6 months and is now a (SAP employee), the second batch started in June2014 has 5 and the new batch has 4 students. Few of them are now almost independent with the process involved with the Educational aids products [including formatting on the computer up to laminating] that we have been training them on and we have recently completed onsite QA and processed our first order from Euro kids for their customized flash cards set. The students are also getting trained in cooking [where we are getting small takeaway orders], fitness, housekeeping etc.

We have documented extensively including video documentation and we are quite happy to share our learning's for ASI's Daksh@home /Daksh Vishesh efforts .One can have a look at some of this work in our website <u>www.amazetrust.org</u> which we have recently launched.

Daksh program @ AMAZE launched in Oct 2013 is also doing very well [3rd batch]. They have trained over 25 students and some of them are doing very well in mainstream and for some others it has been a lifesaver in terms of communication and there are a couple who are doing well on the creativity side also. We combine the technology based efforts with inputs for Special education and communication and social skills [through our other programs like Achint]. More than 100 parents /teachers /professionals also have been trained by the capacity building programs run by us for Technology based intervention .

ASI – Advocacy for Inclusive Education System and Exam Accommodation

Amrutha Ramanujan, Vice President, South has been tirelessly following up with Central ministry of HRD & MSJE about the right exam accommodations for children with Special Needs. She has met the concerned people personally by going to Delhi and convincing them of the need for Right Exam accommodations for our Children. She is in constant touch with them in contrast to the pace of the Ministries

She has also conducted workshop for IB & IGCSE teachers about the need of Modified testing methods for students with Autism in a few International Schools.

She has been counselling and helping families of children with Autism, through emails / Skype meetings / yahoo support group.

Activity line up at Assisted Living for Autistic Adults-ALFAA:

Assisted Living for Autistic Adults, ALFAA founded and directed by Mrs. Ruby Singh has been beaming with activities for their adults taking from Road trips, to Vocational Activities, to festival celebrations, self-help skills and its highlight of their Fashion Show with our Young Adults mentored by Fashion Guru Mr. Prasad Bidappa.

Their article was featured in the Times of India as well, which was a proud moment of awareness of a potential field of employment for individuals with Autism.

- 5. On April 7th, I attended a one day National Conference on Skill Development for persons with Disabilities; it was organized by MSJE and MSDC at Vigyan Bhavan, Mrs. Merry Barua was kind enough to extend the invitation to me.
- 6. On June 25th, I deliberated a one day orientation workshop at Justice Tankha Memorial Institute for Special Needs Children at Jabalpur, MP. It was attended by some 70 participants.
- 7. On July 31st 2015, presented a two hour lecture for the students of DSE-ASD at Action for Autism, Delhi.
- Initiated "Inspire to Aspire" event, which was executed by Ms. Nishath Kirmani Ali and Team Prayas in Bangalore on August 2nd, 2015

I am executing Prayas virtually from Gurgaon on a daily basis, have been an active member towards other activities of ASI and intend to put ASI on International platform along with all other members of ASI.

Another feather in cap for Autism Society of India was that Project Prayas was nominated by the Global Sourcing Council of the US in the Impact Sourcing Category for its 3SAwards which stands for Sustainability, Socially responsible Source. We did not win in the category, but were able to create awareness of Autism and the benefits of technology to the field.
