We have covered a few from 2018 , which we participated in some way but missed out on mentioning them in the Annual Report for 2018 .

WAAD (WORLD AUTISM AWARENESS DAY) : APRIL 1st 2018

1st April 2018, different organizations working in the field of Autism came together to observe World Autism Awareness Day. Approximately fifteen organizations of Bangalore planned many different activities for children, families, college students and the community to participate and support the cause.

WAAD also hosted the MAKE A THON competition where college students came up with very interesting presentations for the awareness of AUTISM.

Autism Society of India was a part of the eventful day at the Jain College Auditorium with very enthusiastic, tireless students running the show of a variety of Cultural programs by children from different Autism schools and centers, Presentation by college students, Film screening – Antarlena (Oriya film with English subtitles) games and lots of Food.

21st October 2018 : Event In Srinagar (Jammu & Kashmir)

Early Intervention & Special Education

1 Day Workshop held at IMPA by Save the Destitute Foundation

The event was organised on behalf of ASI --- by one of the members of ASI in Srinagar

It was aimed to impart information related to early intervention & special education for children with special needs.

It was a great conglomarative event that focused upon inclusion and well being of individuals with Autism .

June 2019 : Mr Sundar Rajan (Jt Secretary – ASI) also did take up the case of the child in a special school in Whitefield being abused in the school by one of the teachers. He did mediate and try to get a rapprochement between the School Authority and the parents of the aggrieved child , but with limited success inspite of his persistent efforts for almost 2 months .

21st July 2019 : Inclusive Marathon - Organised By SAP

<u>August 2019</u> : Initiative taken by the Archbishop of Bangalore (Head of all the churches of Bangalore) to create awareness about people with Special needs amongst all churches of Bangalore .

At a meeting attended by the Bishop , Priests , Parents of People with Special Needs , Sisters and Nuns who run institutions which cater to Special Needs people – a commission was formed to increase awareness across all churches in Bangalore and sensitize all church goers about the challenges faced by people belonging to this category and their families .


Her enthusiasm and commitment to the field of Autism is a good example for a lot of younger parent members of ASI to look upto and follow !!
